CHRISTINA LEANO is a contemplative activist who serves as Associate Director of the Laudato Si' Movement, a global network mobilizing for climate and ecological justice. She also is a trained meditation teacher, retreat facilitator, and spiritual director.

"Dorothy Day and Gospel Nonviolence"



MARTHA HENNESSY is the seventh child of Dorothy Day's only child Tamar. Martha has been arrested and imprisoned protesting nuclear weapons, war, the use of drones, the torture of prisoners in Guantanamo Bay and other prisons, and the use of starvation as a weapon of war in Yemen.

MARIE DENNIS as co-president of Pax Christi International was one of the primary organizers of the 2016 and 2019 conferences on Nonviolence that were cosponsored by the Vatican and Pax Christi International.
